## Freedom of Religion and Speech



### **Question 1 under State Government**

#### **Agree**

I believe there is a strong need to control government spending and reduce waste at every level. Taxpayers deserve transparency, accountability, and efficient use of public funds.

That said, as a candidate for the U.S. Senate, I want to be clear that I would not directly control or dictate Alabama's state budget decisions. Those responsibilities belong to state and local leaders. My role at the federal level would be to work collaboratively with Alabama's elected officials to ensure federal policies support responsible spending, reduce burdens on the state, and deliver real value to our citizens.

From a general policy perspective, I support efforts in Alabama to:

1. **Reduce administrative overlap across agencies** by encouraging efficiency and eliminating duplication where possible.
2. **Increase accountability in economic incentive programs**, ensuring taxpayer dollars are tied to measurable results and long-term benefits for the state.
3. **Improve oversight of government contracting and consulting**, so public funds are used effectively and transparently.

At the federal level, I would advocate for policies that give states more flexibility, reduce unfunded mandates, and ensure that Alabama is not forced into inefficient spending by federal requirements. My goal is to be a partner to the state—supporting good governance, not imposing it.

### **Question 3 under State Government**

I support an Article V Convention because it provides a constitutional path for the states to address structural issues Congress has failed to fix—such as the lack of term limits in both the legislative and judicial branches. While there are concerns about the process, the ultimate safeguard remains: no amendment becomes law without ratification by 38 states. We must be willing to take that risk to restore balance, accountability, and trust in our federal government.
